



Welcome to Tyrone Whiting

Mr Tyrone Whiting and his husband Sean moved into our area last summer and he took the position of Director of Music at St. Martin-in-the-Fields Episcopal Church as of January 19, 2021. He is most definitely a wonderful rising star and prize winning performer, hailing originally from the UK. He studied at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music, and the Royal College of Music in London. Some of his teachers included David Graham, Sophie-Veronique Cauchefer-Choplin, William Whitehead, Ann Elise Smoot, and Daniel Moult for organ, and conducting with Peter Stark and Howard Williams. He won the Geoffrey Singleton Prize for organ performance in 2010, 2011 and 2012, and Cardnell Organ Prize in 2011 and 2012. He was awarded the Associateship diploma of the Royal College of Organists in 2011. He had studied Music Performance Science at the Royal College of Music (RCM) and returned there in 2016 to earn a Master of Music degree. He has had many other studies and has performed extensively in Europe and North America.

Tyrone served as Director of Music at St. Mary's Parish Church in Battersea from 2012 to early 2018, where he developed a recital series, a choral scholarship program, as well as conducting several large scale concerts. He.accepted the post of Director of Music at Grace Church in Newark, NJ in 2017, moving to the States to assume that job in early 2018. He had a wonderful impact on music in Newark, founding The Brick City Chorus, extending the Chorister Choir School program, and augmenting music at Grace and in Newark in general.

He holds a Licentiateship diploma of Trinity College, London in Instrumental and Vocal Teaching with distinction, and teaches organ, piano, conducting, and theory. He also served as Head of Music at Elmhurst Independent School for Boys for many years, and as animateur in in London schools and with the London Mozart Players.

He describes himself as having 'a lot of energy, and looks forward to creating great things in Philadelphia.' We are very lucky that he is now part of OUR AGO chapter!! Welcome, Tyrone, we look forward to a wonderful partnership! We are blessed to have you!

Its organ was inaugurated by Virgil Fox, who traveled from New York City to Westport to play the new instrument, built by Boston's Aeolian-Skinner Organ Company. It was christened Cecilia Rose, after the patron saint of music.



He was a clarinet and voice major while there, but began more seriously taking up the organ during his time there. Graduating in 1998, he went into teaching high school music in Philadelphia, including general music and choir.

He was an accompanist for the Philadelphia Gospel Seminar Choir, a group that at the time was singing gospel mostly in the Catholic Diocese. Their reputation spread and they went on to perform in Europe, including for the Pope in Vatican Square. They were truly a local treasure! He also served as a staff organist for the First Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church for over twenty years.

Damien has played for various churches, and is now serving at St. Anne's Episcopal Church in Middletown Delaware. He continues in education, now serving as an administrator for the Kennett Consolidated School District in Kennett Square, PA. Mr. Josh Dove owner of the Whitsel Organ Company of Harrisonburg Virginia and CEO of Viscount North America has recently appointed him Sales Representative of Whitesel Church Organs of Delaware Valley which supplies and services Viscount Organs of Modaino Italy. Quoting from his church web site: Damien has traveled extensively throughout the United States and Europe sharing the message of Jesus Christ through the joy of music. People who have worked with Mr. Jones say that "his musical ability connects them spiritually and mentally so that the music and the message becomes one entity."

WHERE AM I?

he September instrument is the beautiful organ in Irvine Auditorium at the University of Pennsylvania, Austin Organ Co. (Opus 1416, 1926), the Curtis Organ, originally built in 1926 for the Sesquicentennial International Exposition held in Philadelphia. Afterward, the organ was purchased by publisher Cyrus Curtis, donated to the University of Pennsylvania, and installed in the newly-built Irvine Auditorium in 1928-29. It was named the Cyrus H. K. Curtis Organ in honor of Mr. Curtis.

TALE PIPES

For the Beauty of the Earth Text: Folliott S. Pierpoint, 1835-1917; Music: Conrad Kocher, 1786-1872; Tune: Dix

uring these months with nature's beauty all around, now rich with the colors of fall, I wanted to explore this classic hymn of praise. The author is said to have written it "one day in late spring near his native city of Bath, England, when violets and primroses were in full bloom and all the earth seemed to rejoice. He climbed up a hill and sat down to rest and meditate. The panorama before him inspired him to write these beautiful lines." (Armin Haeussler, *The Story of Our Hymns*, pg. 66).

For the beauty of the earth, for the glory of the skies, For the love which from our birth over and around us lies: Lord of all, * to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise.

Pierpoint earned an M.A. from Queen's College in Cambridge, taught and was headmaster for a while at Somersetshire College, but went on to spend the remainder of his life traveling and writing. He had seven volumes of hymns and sacred poems, this one originally being published in Lyra Eucharistica in 1864 where it was titled 'The Sacrifice of Praise.' His final stanza, not always included in hymnals, is in praise and thanks for God himself.

> For thyself, best Gift Divine, to the world so freely given, for that great, great love of thine, peace on earth, and joy in heaven.



The tune generally associated with this hymn is known as Dix because it was paired with 'As With Gladness, Men of Old' by William Dix. Composer Conrad Kocher, born in Wurttemberg, and his music studies took him to St. Petersburg, where he worked as a tutor as a young person, and later in life to Rome where he was influenced by Palstrina's music. He settled in Stuttgart and founded the School for Sacred Music, was a proponent of four part singing, wrote a treatise on church music – Die Tonkunst in der Kirche (1823), composed many hymns as well as an oratorio, operas, and sonatas. The tune Dix was originally composed in 1838 as Stimmen aus dem Reiche Gottes but William Henry Monk adapted it in 1861 for the 'As With Gladness' text in Hymns Ancient and Modern (1861).

Many of you will be very familiar with the stunning setting of the text of this hymn by John Rutter in his SATB Choral Octavo. I had the privilege of conducting this with a multi-voice choir and instrumentalists, and while we were sharing this wonderful work a little boy with autism who was there with his family ran up to the front of the church and began dancing around me as I conducted – such a joyful moment!

*This phrase in many hymnals is 'Christ Our God'
