I caught up with **John Walthausen**, who has been in Philadelphia for 3 years now, and who took



position of Director of Music at The First Presbyterian Church in Germantown in November of 2020. He is an organist and harpsichord player and does a lot of ensemble playing. He has a trio called Filament that's been around for about 2 1/2 vears and that includes Evan Few on violin and Elena Smith on viola da gamba they perform in the area. John is originally from NYC, and

has had quite a circuitous route in getting to Philadelphia. First to Ohio and Oberlin for undergraduate studies, followed by a Masters degree in Paris in organ performance, and Masters in Historical Performance in Basel, Switzerland. Following his European adventures in higher education he served as organist in residence in Sapporo Concert Hall in Japan. We are so lucky that he's now in our neighborhood!

I asked how he's coping given current challenges, and he said that COVID has been tough, and just this past week has involved many rapid adjustments. He had just finished planning the rest of the season at church and found out that they have to move back from choir to just section leaders for the balance of the month. "We had been just finding our footing with a growing choral ensemble, after having a very enjoyable Christmas and several new members in the choir." For much of 2020 they were virtual, with worship services prerecorded. Then they moved to in person with live stream for those joining virtually. He shared that now they have a more professional live stream, having improved from a fairly basic arrangement. "The sound is still somewhat improvised and could improve. It's been frustrating not having the music really streamed appropriately."

I asked if there were any up sides, and he shared that the trio members have been home more and able to practice together more, so having everyone centered in Philly gave them more togetherness and concentration. "In the weeks ahead I look forward to working with my four section leaders at church as a quartet to build listening among my core singers, and I think I will know better where to go from here."

**Max Esmus** is Organist at Calvary Lutheran Church in West Chester as of March, 2021. There's a really nice team there – Music director is Kendra Werner, and the director of children's music is Susan Brizick. He is originally from North Eastern

PA in Towanda, 15 miles from the NY state border. Max started piano at 12 and was involved in the local Methodist church and their music program, and then went on to earn a BA in Music Theory and Composition with minor in Organ from the Indiana University of PA. He then earned his MM in choral conducting from Rowan University in NJ.




Regarding COVID, he said, "Because my responsibilities are really only organ and piano, I am fortunate enough to not have to make the difficult decisions about what to do. Whatever they decide to do, I am there to support them." He shared that they had been worshiping in person, masked indoors, and that there was congregational and choral singing, in person and live streamed. A good third of the congregation continues to attend virtually. Before the choir came back in the fall all vocal music was done by solo cantors. "I hadn't had an organist position since before the pandemic hit - so I was suddenly accompanying one voice instead of a whole congregation. We have to think about what the experience is for an in-person congregation singing through a mask. I often use my MIDI system to record my registration plan for a hymn, and then go out into the church and try to sing. One of the things I'm doing is to play with simpler, clearer registrations, unless it's a very, very familiar hymn. I'm not using mixtures and reeds as much as I would when the room is full and back to normal. I recommend getting off the bench and experiencing how the organ sounds as you try to sing with a mask!"

I caught up with **Colin O'Malley** and asked about how he came to the organ and how things have been going. He started playing piano at 8, and then started playing the organ in 8th grade – he was exposed to organ music through church, and was asked to start playing organ for his elementary school's weekly Mass, which he described as trial by



Colin started taking lessons and playing paid positions for two parishes in the area roughly in 12th grade, studying with Rudy Lucente. After graduating he went to West Chester University and majored in music composition and a concentration in piano, actually jazz. During that time he accepted the position of organist/music director at Paoli United Methodist Church from

the end of Freshman college year, and while there he rebuilt a modest choir.


Colin began organ studies with Sandor Kadar through the AGO Next program during his undergraduate years. He left Paoli Methodist in 2018 to accept the position at Calvary Lutheran Church in West Chester, which he served until taking the organist position at Calvary Presbyterian in Wyncote as Director of Music. Had the pandemic not happened, he would have taken a break from church music and become a piano bar entertainer for a cruise ship, featuring dueling pianos, with different shows every night – he was a few weeks away from

signing a contract when everything shut down. He lost much of his freelance work due to the pandemic which included playing at various Catholic churches. He now directs an adult choir, a Hand Bell Choir, plays a nice Moller organ, and works with two professional soloists. He considers playing as assistant orgnaist at St. John Neumann Parish in Bryn Mawr to be his other 'main' job, and has been with them in a freelance capacity since 2018.

He shared that, "Having to start a position in the midst of shut down is very interesting! It was almost like having two different start dates, because things were so different when choir resumed. Prior to that we had worked with soloists and needed minimal rehearsal. We have been able to do some decent things!!" He says that he's still able to do what he really would like to do, because of all the music talent within the group that is still there. "I cannot stress enough how things really started all over again when the church opened up - It was no longer week to week planning, I had to get used to planning music etc. out long term, something I had not done since I left Paoli, and this was now on a much larger scale. Also, I had virtually no experience with handbells, so I had to very quickly learn bell technique, how to read bell scores, etc. But I found directing them to be far easier than I expected. I still can't ring myself, but I've figured out how to effectively lead and rehearse the choir. They usually ring every 3 weeks, playing 1-2 pieces each performance date."

COVID gave him the time to focus on organ and music more than he might have, and he got to know Chris Kehoe and more people in the guild. He plays in a wedding band and plays jazz piano, and is gradually returning to more of that. He's enjoyed the 20's and 30's chapter events, networking with folks in the guild.

# **TALE PIPES**

had been planning to share information about a wonderful event being planned at the Episcopal Cathedral, **Singing the African American Spirituals With Integrity** – and sadly, thanks to COVID, it is being rescheduled. But do look for registration information later in the spring!

During times that have been confusing and turbulent, it is more important than ever to find ways to connect and grow in understanding as a community. The planned Cathedral workshop will seek to help church musicians, clergy and lay people learn how to introduce the repertoire of the African American Spirituals to their choirs and congregations. It will feature fantastic clinicians from our area, including Dr. Jay Fluellen, a Philadelphia born musician with his doctorate in music composition from Temple, who teaches at Northeast High School, has taught in many area colleges, has had compositions commissioned by many organizations, and who serves as organist/choir director at the historic African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas where he directs the Chancel Choir, a contemporary jazz ensemble, and co-directs a Men's Choir. His high school choir has been featured at the Kimmel Center, and I had the good fortune to meet him over Zoom. About the upcoming workshop he said,

"My main goal is to bring out the common humanity that we share in the experience – the true humanity of these lyrics, these melodies, that are so powerful. The tug and pull of the spirituals – there are so many different arrangements, even though I've studied so many styles in classical music, the spirituals are really an anchor of what I do as a composer and a director. We as African Americans feel that as long as you approach them with respect, they can be part of your sacred music repertoire. Like anyone else I learned how to approach them with respect and reverence, and that has helped me."

Not only are the Spirituals a national treasure, created by an oppressed people being dehumanized by those in power, but they also are beautiful music that did not earn royalties for its creators. A January 8 interview on NPR's Weekend Edition featured pastor Susan DeSelms at United Parish in Brookline, and their resolution to take an offering each time a Spiritual is sung in church and donate that money to the Hamilton-Garrett Music and Arts in the Boston community of Roxbury. (Full interview available at www.npr.org) Definitely worthy food for thought as we seek to move forward.

I have long had a deep respect for and appreciation of Spirituals and want to end by sharing one that I've used in many settings – most recently with children over Zoom, doing American Sign Language with the chorus. Many years ago I added a couple of my own verses as part of the funeral for a developmentally disabled man who we often welcomed into our home:

**Refrain:** All night, all day, angels watching over me my Lord, All night, all day, angels watching over me!

- 1. I'm so blessed with friends on earth, Angels watching over me my Lord, Love surrounds me from my birth, Angels watching over me!
- 2. Love surrounds us all our days ............
  Blessing us in so many ways .............
