**Emily Amos** is from Louisiana originally, but moved to Michigan to major in organ at the Interlochen Arts Academy for her junior and senior years of high school. Emily said, "My first piano teacher was also a church organist and one day she decided to stick me on the bench of her digital practice organ I was hooked! I attended my first POE at the age of 9 – I was able to go because my mom was able to accompany me. That first POE was in Gainsville, FLA. I have attended many summer intensives since, including Oberlin, Eastman, Baylor, and also the Curtis Summer Organ Institute in collaboration with Wanamaker Organ, with Alan

Morrison, Matt Glandorf, and Peter Richard Conte." Emily began her studies at Curtis in the fall of 2019.

How do you like Philadelphia? "I've really enjoyed my time in Philly – it's really great to be in such an organ hub. In Louisiana and Michigan I was in small towns, and it's neat to be in an area with so many instruments."

She is serving as the 'organ scholar' at St. Paul's Episcopal Chestnut Hill – "We did a lot of music with quartets and octets during the pandemic. It's been great for building up my church experience – I've been able to really polish up hymn playing and accompanying." Emily has been part of our chapter since arriving in Philadelphia, and she joined the executive committee in 2021.

Claire Mead and her husband Bob moved to Bryn Mawr last June from their home in rural northern NH, where they lived for nearly 50 years. "We both were born in Philly and grew up in Bristol, PA, so we've returned home, so to speak. I was a longtime member of



Vermont-AGO, having been introduced to it by my piano/organ teacher. Due to unrelated work demands I haven't had a church job for a number of years, except for a tiny bit of subbing. As a result I've become quite rusty, but want to keep up my connection to AGO ("friend" in the VT chapter) because of my love of the instrument and the music.

I'm retired from the K-6 education world. My only responsibility now is as coordinator of the Ogontz Choral Workshop in Lyman, NH, a very part-time gig. We've attended since 1991 and call it our 'annual once-in-a life experience'. After having to hold the event on Zoom for the last two years, we're really looking forward to being there in person again in August." [See her article "The Other Ogontz" on p. 9]

"Looking forward to meeting you at an organ event in the near future."

Luke Staisiunas is currently in West Chester, PA and grew up in Yardley, PA. He went to the University of Oklahoma for BM and MM degrees and during his undergraduate years he also took organ technology courses. His major was Organ perfor-



mance. I asked what led him to the U of O, and he said that he chose them because he could do traditional organ, theatre organ and organ technology. While he was in High School and throughout part of college, he got to experience the Summer Youth Adventure through American Theater Organ Society - he took part in from 2011 – 2019. He studied with John Schwandt and Adam Pajan as an undergraduate, and Adam Pajan and Damin Spritzer as a graduate student. Currently he is 'subbing around' until he finds something permanent.

I asked what positives he may have noticed during this interesting time and he said, "It's nice to have churches be appreciative that you are there, the churches with cranky folks are few and far between—especially after a long time of not seeing each other face to face. People seem extra appreciative of having live music after long stretches without. Another positive is that I've gotten better at networking—it's been nice to finally actually talk to people who are normally just faces in boxes on social media feeds."

Thank you and Welcome, Luke!

Ron Chancler grew up in a Catholic church and became an altar boy in 4th grade. He remembers loving to listen to the organ and the all boys choir, that his younger brother was part of. He began piano in 6th grade, all the while serving in church. When he stopped



serving as an altar boy in 8th grade, his younger brother had begun asking to practice the organ, and he followed suit, not wanting to be outdone by a little brother! He began playing in church by the age of 13. For college he attended Penn State, majoring in Business Administration, and during that time he didn't have a church position, but following college he returned to playing. He wound up taking a good job with the state of NJ and took a few years away from the organ. Eventually a nun urged him to come play, and he took the position at St. Joseph the Worker in Fallsington, PA, in 1983, and he began taking formal organ training. St. Joseph closed in June of 2014 and he went to St. Francis Cabrini in Fairless Hills, and then to St. Matthew the Apostle in Edison, N.J., in 2016 to play a beautiful 3 manual Peragallo Pipe Organ – a 35 mile trek – and a 40 voice choir which he accompanied. In 2018 he let go the long commute and accepted the position of music director at St Ephrem in Bensalem, PA, where he directs the choir and plays the organ. He was able to study for a bit with John Romeri while he was in our area, and he passed the Service Playing test.

Ron is a member of the Philadelphia Chapter AGO as well as the Southeastern PA chapter, and he is on the SEPA executive committee. He recounts that his church kept him on through the height of the COVID crisis, for which he is grateful – for some time they did livestreaming with just the priest, the nuns, and him. Many choir members dropped out as they were older and have health issues. At present there are 6 back, and another with health issues hopes to return, but he expects to start recruiting soon. "I intend to play until I can't!"

#### New member Claire Mead's "annual once-in-a-lifetime experience"

Now in its 33rd season, the **Ogontz Choral Workshop** offers an extraordinary opportunity for singers, church musicians, and choral conductors to study significant repertoire with some of the world's leading choral directors. Participants include musicians and singers of many diverse backgrounds.

The 2022 Workshop will be held August 7 - 13 at Ogontz Camp, an intimate rustic resort nestled in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. Renowned for its hospitality, natural beauty and excellent food, the camp was once the summer retreat of the Ogontz School in Philadelphia.

This year's repertoire includes:

Ralph Vaughan Williams Toward The Unknown Region (1907), a remarkable marriage of music and Walt Whitman's text; and his Mass in g minor (1921), a distinctly English work in five unaccompanied movements.

**Johannes Brahms** *Vier Quartette*, Op. 92 (1884), a setting of four secular poems by Goethe, Daumer, Allmers, and Hebbel.

Initiated in 1990 by George Kent, current Camp owner and former Music Director of The Chorus of Westerly (RI), the event was directed for many years by Sir David Willcocks, Kent's friend and mentor. It now continues under the masterful leadership of David Hill, who is widely respected as a conductor throughout the UK and Europe. He currently serves as Musical Director of London's Bach Choir and as Principal Conductor of Yale University's Schola Cantorum. Hill is the recipient of the Royal College of Organists' highest honor, the RCO Medal, "in recognition of distinguished achievement in choral conducting and organ playing," and was appointed Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) in 2019.

Paula Rockwell, a professional voice clinician on the faculty at Acadia University in her native Nova Scotia, provides master classes, instruction in vocal technique, and a solo recital. Paula is a dynamic teacher who receives rave reviews by all who attend.

It is with sadness that I share the news that our friend and long time colleague **Jack Charles** passed away on Saturday, October 9, 2021. John D. 'Jack' Charles, 79, was born in Minersville, which is in Schuylkill County, PA. After finishing high school there, he went to West Chester University, then West Chester State Teachers College, where he met his wife of 56 years, Andrea Fry Charles. He was a beloved teacher in the Perkiomen Valley School District for 34 years, serving as the choral music teacher.

Jack loved the organ and served several churches in the area. First Augustus Lutheran in Trappe and Grace Lutheran in Royersford, and then St. John's Lutheran in Phoenixville where he is very fondly remembered as having championed their wonderful music program and organ. His longest appointment was as music director for St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Devon, where he shared the instrument for chapter Tuesday Noon recitals. After leaving St. Luke's, he settled at Centennial Lutheran in Kimberton until his health necessitated his retirement.

Jack was a member of our chapter for many, many years, and very involved in chapter events. He spent much time working on music at home as well, and has a very musical family. He and Andrea live quite close to their daughter Elizabeth and her family, husband Matthew, and children Sean and Heather, and often enjoyed music making together.
