


## **DEAN'S LETTER**

his summer I had the great fortune to attend two terrific conventions - one in Richmond, VA for the Association of Anglican Musicians (AAM), and the other in Seattle, for the National AGO. I always enjoy spending time in a new part of the world, worship, fellowship, and workshops on topics new and old.



We are fortunate at Washington Memorial Chapel to have a substantial music library. Even with access to all of the scores in the world, there is still more that I uncover each day. I'd like to share with you two resources that you may not know about, encourage you to check them out, and program new (to you) music.

At AAM in Richmond, I attended a presentation by Marques Garrett, Assistant Professor of Music in Choral Activities at the University of Nebraska—Lincoln in the Glenn Korff School of Music. He is a terrific musician and has compiled lots of BIPOC choral repertoire and other resources. You can find a link to his specific list below and can explore more of his website once you are there. I had a wonderful round table discussion with Janet Yieh and walked away with a long list of learnings. One question she asked was, what do you find challenging about programming music of women composers? Let that one sit for a moment. It is so important to have these conversations and I'm so grateful to Janet for leading this discussion. She held the space beautifully. 

## **Johann Vexo Biography**

Johann Vexo was born in the French city of Nancy, close to the borders of Belgium, Luxembourg, and Germany. Influenced by the rich musical and cultural heritage of this part of Europe, Johann's training and performance career developed rapidly and at age 25 he was appointed Choir Organist at the Cathedral of Notre Dame, Paris. Soon thereafter he was also appointed Organist of the Cavaillé-Coll organ of the Cathedral in Nancy. He is also Professor of Organ at the Conservatory as well as the Superior Music Academy in Strasbourg. Johann Vexo began his organ studies with Christophe Mantoux at the Strasbourg Conservatory where he was awarded Premier Prix in organ. He continued at the Paris Conservatory where his teachers included Michel Bouvard and Olivier Latry for organ and Thierry Escaich and Philippe Lefebvre for improvisation. He

has performed extensively throughout Europe, the United States, Canada, Mexico, Australia, New Zealand and Russia including performances in Auckland, Chicago, Geneva, Los Angeles, Melbourne, Montréal, Munich, New York, Saint Petersburg, San Francisco and Vienna. Known for his generous, supportive, and captivating teaching style, Mr. Vexo has taught master classes at Rice University, the Curtis Institute of Music, the University of Michigan. Johann Vexo has made several recordings of French classical and German romantic music on historic French organs. His most recent recording, performed on the great organ of Notre Dame Cathedral, Paris, was released on the JAV label. He has over 50 performance videos featured on YouTube. Johann Vexo is represented in North America exclusively by Phillip Truckenbrod Concert Artists, LLC

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

The 13 rank, pipe organ, Opus 6298, manufactured by the Wicks Pipe Organ Company of Highland, Illinois was constructed by Wicks between August to December 1993 in Ohio. The organ has 886 pipes. The console provides 25 stops in three divisions (Great, Swell and Pedal) as well as tremolo and chimes. Dedicated on April 10, 1994; with a dedicatory recital on May 1, 1994. (Keep in mind that although it is an OPUS 6298 – it was custom built for Trinity).





### **TALE PIPES**

Mary Elizabeth Campbell, CAGO, Editor

For this month I thought it was only fair to supply the solutions to last month's 'American Sacred Music History Game.' These represent a wide variety of the parallel threads from our fascinating sacred music and organ history.

- 1. I Frances Jane 'Fanny' Crosby, who was blind, lived from 1820-1915 and is said to have written more than 8,000 hymns, including 'Jesus is Tenderly Calling,' and 'Blessed Assurance.' She was also a teacher and a mission worker. She was known as the "Queen of Gospel Song Writers."
- 2. E **William Billings**, 1746-1800, was born in Boston and trained as a tanner to support his family when his father died. He was thought to be mostly self taught in music, and went on to be an important very early American choral composer, and part of the First New England School. His beautiful Lenten hymn round 'When Jesus Wept' is known across denominations.
- 3. F Robert Lowry was born in Philadelphia, studied at the University of Lewisburg, and became a Baptist minister. He held many pastorates between New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, and served as a professor at Lewisburg. He worked editing hymnals with Biglow and Main and is now remembered as a hymn writer in his own right, with over 500 tunes and texts. These included 'Shall We Gather at the River' and 'I Need Thee Every Hour.'
- 4. C **Bishop Richard Allen**, 1760-1831, was a minister, writer, abolitionist, educator, and very influential Black leader who founded the African Methodist Episcopal church, opening the first one in 1794 in Philadelphia. He knew and worked with Absalom Jones. He published a hymnal for his church in 1801.
- 5. J **Phillip Brooks**, 1835-1893, born in Boston, was a Harvard graduate who then attended Virginia Theological Seminary and was ordained an Episcopal priest. He served at the Church of the Holy Trinity in Philadelphia, and later Trinity Church in Boston. He may now be best known for writing 'O Little Town of Bethlehem.'

- 6. A **The Sacred Harp** is a tunebook featuring Shape Notes, a system used for sacred choral music that began in New England and then spread south.
- 7. H **Thomas Andrew Dorsey**, 1899-1993, came to be known as the 'Father of Gospel Music.' He was a singer, pianist and composer in sacred and secular music, and combined up-tempo blues with gospel hymns. Note this is NOT the band leader Tommy Dorsey! He founded the National Convention of Gospel Choirs and Choruses in 1933.
- 8. B William Bachelder Bradbury, 1816-1868, grew up on the family farm in York, ME. They moved to Boston in 1830 where he fell in love with the organ, becoming a church organist at 15. He studied singing with Dr Lowell Mason. His music career eventually took him to New York City, and in addition to church work he led a 1,000 voice children's choir and was instrumental in founding music festivals and getting music included in NYC schools. Among his many hymns was the tune 'Jesus Loves Me.'
- 9. G **Mary Carlisle Howe**, 1882-1964, was born in Richmond, VA, studied piano and composition at Peabody in Baltimore, and in 1933 studied with Nadia Boulanger in Paris. She spent most of her life in the Washington, DC, area, and composed for orchestra, chorus, piano, organ and more.
- 10. D **Dudley Buck**, 1839-1909, was born in Hartford, CT. He attended Trinity College, and then Leipzig Conservatory. By 1875 he was in New York City as organist for Holy Trinity Church, Brooklyn. He was known as a composer of church music and wrote The Influence of the Organ in History which is available through the OHS online catalog!
