

The Ardmore Presbyterian sanctuary organ began as a 1959 Moeller of some 40 ranks, to which a three-stop antiphonal was added in the early 1970's. In 2000-02 it was rebuilt, revoiced, and enlarged by Luley and Associates to 57 ranks and 3,300 pipes across Great, Swell, Choir, Antiphonal, and Pedal divisions.

There Shall Be No Night There The long forgotten story of David D. Wood

oon after retiring from my position at Wayne Presbyterian Church in 2015, I assumed the role of Archivist for the Chapter. After getting a committee together (now Rae Ann Anderson, Dennis Elwell, and Karen Whitney), the archives began their association with the Organ Historical Society (est. 1956) which had just moved to Stoneleigh in Villanova. In 2017, I came across the forgotten story of Philadelphia's most significant organist and church musician of the nineteenth century, David D. Wood (1838-1910). Born in Pittsburgh, he lost his sight through accident and illness. In 1843, at age five, his parents put him in the care of a traveling merchant for the long journey to Philadelphia to be educated at the Pennsylvania Institute for the Instruction of the Blind, then at Twentieth and Race Streets, later in Overbrook. He lived the rest of his life in Philadelphia.

David Wood was regarded by some as the most skilled organist in Philadelphia and by others as the finest in America. It has been said that at the time of his passing, three quarters of the organists in the city had studied with him or with one of his students. The legendary significance of Wood's life and work was universally celebrated and accepted both during his life and after his death, yet the awareness of the impact his life and work had on musical Philadelphia faded after World War II and has been lost to succeeding generations.

He was educated at the Pennsylvania Institute for the Instruction of the Blind. At age 14 he was appointed Assistant Teacher of Music there, and as Director of Music from 1887 until his death. He taught at the Philadelphia Musical Academy from 1879 to 1910. Wood was Organist and Director of Music at St Stephen's Episcopal Church at Tenth below Market (1864-1910) and concurrently at the Baptist Temple at Broad and Berks, now Temple University's Performing Arts Center (1885-1909).

Wood founded the American Organ Players' Club in 1890, a national organization like the AGO which remained active until 1984. When the AGO was organized in 1896, he was one of 150 distinguished founding members.

Wood was the owner of the first copy of Bach's complete organ works ever brought to Philadelphia which came to him after the death of his first teacher, Wilhelm Schnabel, in 1852. At a time



when Bach's music was regarded as nothing more than an archaic historical curiosity, Wood was first to grasp its significance and champion his music.

In the course of my research, I discovered Newspaper articles that revealed the unexpected fact that David Wood's music was being played and featured in Iowa in the 1930s. That is when I began to wonder if his music, papers, and letters might still exist. After doing some genealogy, I located a branch of his descendants living in Davenport. I reached out to them in the summer of 2018 and found that David Wood through his second wife, Alice Burdette, saved everything, and that their descendants had been reverently safeguarding these treasures for over a century

David Wood's Great-Granddaughter, Brooke, was the family custodian of this legacy. She and her husband reside in London, England. Brooke vis-ited The Organ Historical Society in 2019. Bynum Petty and I convinced her of the wisdom of archiving her Great-Grandfather's legacy at the Philadelphia Archives and OHS. The original proposal to bring these archives back to Philadelphia in 2020 was delayed by the pandemic.

Brooke came to Philadelphia this year on Wednesday, November 2. On Thursday, Brooke brought David Wood's extant archives to Villanova to be archived at the Organ Historical Society. Besides his music and papers, these archives will eventually include two, two foot high silver loving cups and a portrait.

Brooke had never heard any of her Great-Grandfather's music. On Friday, November 4 about twenty singers, interested organists, and archivists met for an informal meet and greet at Stoneleigh. The two hour seminar included a power point which I had prepared for the occasion, a break for some wine and cheese, and then a session when those assembled formed a choir (of sorts) accompanied by the OHS Aeolian Skinner op. 878 and sight read through some of Wood's choral music, giving Brooke a (very rough) taste of her Great-Grandfather's music for the first time.

I want to thank those who gave up a chunk on their Friday to attend the event. Brooke left very pleased and confident in her decision to entrust her ancestor's archives and legacy with the Philadelphia Chapter Archives and the Organ Historical Society.






