
I am rolling into the new year with a tremendous amount of excitement and hope. The Chapel community is doing a lot of wonderful work in the world, and our music program is expanding!

January JumpStart Presenter Biographies

Dr. Eileen Hunt is the current President of AGO National. She was most recently Vice President/ Councillor for Competitions and New Music. In her role as VP, she chaired the Strategic Planning initiative. Currently, she has three committees and two task forces in her portfolio: the Personnel Committee, the National Nominating Committee, the Sexual Harassment Review Board, the Task Force on Denominational Music Organizations, and the Task Force on Gender Equity.

She is active as a performer and has presented recitals throughout the US and Europe, with a particular interest in performing new music. She has performed at national and regional conventions of the AGO. As a church musician, she has served parishes in Connecticut and Massachusetts. Dr. Hunt holds degrees in organ and musicology from Boston University and has studied in Paris with André Isoir and Jean Langlais. In her free time, she enjoys travel, reading, cooking, and cheering for her beloved Boston Red Sox. Eileen resides in Salem, Massachusetts with her husband, Mark English.

Dr. Damin Spritzer is Area Chair and Associate Professor of Organ at the University of Oklahoma since 2014. Formerly Adjunct Professor at the University of North Texas teaching Organ Literature and Sacred Music, she continues work with the Cathedral Church of Saint Matthew in Dallas as Artistin-Residence for Cathedral Arts. She is active in the Dallas and Oklahoma City Chapters of the AGO. For the Organ Historical Society, she serves on the Library Archives Committee, and for the Association of Anglican Musicians, on their editorial board.

She received her Bachelor of Music from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, her Master of Music from the Eastman School of Music, and her doctorate from the University of North Texas. Alsatian-American composer René Louis Becker (1882-1956) was the topic of her doctoral research and she edits a continuing multi-volume critical edition of Becker's organ music for Wayne Leupold Editions which will release her monograph on the composer.

Tom Trenney is in his twelfth season as Minister of Music to First-Plymouth Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, where he shepherds three adult choirs, accompanies the congregation on the Lied organ, preaches sermons, and serves as Artistic Director of the Abendmusik Concert Series. Since Fall 2019, Tom has been Assistant Professor of Music and Conductor of Choirs at Nebraska Wesleyan University. Tom's choral compositions have been published by Augsburg Fortress, Beckenhorst Press, Choristers Guild, E.C. Schirmer/Galaxy, Morningstar, MusicSpoke, Pavane, and G. Schirmer. His music has been sung in churches and colleges around the country.





St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Glenside PA, a warm, welcoming, and inclusive congregation, seeks a versatile and enthusiastic part-time choir director/Organist to support and enhance the church's long tradition of musical excellence in worship. The successful candidate will draw on strong organ and choral conducting skills, as well as knowledge of a variety of musical influences including traditional Episcopal music, and the ability to support and engage an all-volunteer choir.

The Episcopal tradition is the primary guide for the liturgy and hymns, but a variety of traditions and styles in vocal music is, at times, appropriate and desired. Duties include directing and accompanying the choir (including 1 weeknight rehearsal), collaborating with other musical groups such as the Parish Handbell Choir, the Folk Group, and working with the rector to plan and conduct the worship of the church. Liturgical responsibilities include the weekly 10 a.m. worship, Christmas, Holy Week and Easter services.

Wayne Presbyterian Church seeks a temporary parttime Organist/Accompanist to accompany chancel choir rehearsals and small vocal ensembles (Thursdays, 7:30-9:30pm) and assist with approximately half of the service music on Sunday mornings (traditional services at 9:30 and 11:00am). 
