"A National treasure" - Gerre Hancock

C. B. Fisk Organ, Opus 51 Zion Mennonite Church, Souderton, Pa

he late Gerre Hancock, who was considered the premier classical improvisational organist in America, called the Fisk mechanical action pipe organ at Zion Mennonite Church, Cherry Lane, Souderton, a "National treasure," on a number of occasions. I met Mr. Hancock when I was attending a boy choir workshop. At the time, he was the director of the renowned St. Thomas Choir of Men and Boys, Fifth Avenue, New York. We sat next to each other at the closing banquet, and when I mentioned that there was a Fisk organ at Zion Mennonite Church, where I was the music director, he said, "I've got to play it!" Gerre had already played the dedicatory recitals on a number of the larger Fisk organs throughout the United States, Europe, and Japan.

Charles B. Fisk (1925-1983) actually took up residence in the Souderton area for six weeks when the Fisk Opus 51 (1968) was being installed in Zion Mennonite Church. As a scholar of historic and early performance practice, Charles Fisk may best be remembered for his Wellesley College organ (1981) which achieved a new distinction in the construction of organs according to historic principles. Duke University music professor Fenner Douglass called Fisk "the Picasso of organ builders." The most recent Fisk installation is at Christ Church in Philadelphia, Opus 150 (3 manuals, 49 stops, 44 independent voices, 3,095 pipes). I was privileged to hear Alan Morrison, head of the organ department at The Curtis Institute of Music, give the dedicatory recital. It was a thrill for me to have been involved with one of the early Fisk organs for over 22 years and then, to hear the newest one. Up until this year, the only Fisk organ in Pennsylvania was at Zion Mennonite Church.

At the time the organ was contracted, the church's building was still in the design stage and here, for the first time, Charles Fisk was able to work in collaboration with an architect, Edward A. Sövik. The spare but graceful design of the case and the favorable acoustical climate of the building were achieved by organ builder and architect in an atmosphere of mutual respect. When the organ was completed, Fisk told a member of Sövik's Firm: "We ourselves feel that it is one of our most successful instruments. A good part of the reason for the organ's tonal success is the building's acoustics, which for music are simply elegant. I was grateful to see that the organ, which might inadvertently have become a visual focal point, seemed not to obtrude upon the serenity of the place." - from Charles Brenton Fisk, Organ Builder, compiled and edited by Barbara Owen, 1968.



To me, even though the building is contemporary in design, it has an ageless quality about it. I remember on occasions when folks would come down from New York or surrounding states to attend concerts, they would think that the church was recently built, even though it was over 40 years old at that time. When Edward A. Sövik retired, he travelled all over the world to visit as many of his creations as he could fit in. Elvin Souder and I had the pleasure of having dinner with Mr. Sövik at the Century House when he came to look over Zion Mennonite Church. There was once a meeting of various prominent architects who went through the building. They concluded that Zion Mennonite Church may one day be on the same level as a Frank Lloyd Wright building.

In 2018, Gordon Turk gave a recital celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Fisk Organ. Other prominent organists who have performed on Zion's organ include Marilyn Mason, Felix Hell, Cameron Carpenter, Stephan Engels, Barbara Bruns, Gail Archer, Marian Archibald, Mark Bani, and Scott Myers. There is something very special about the C. B. Fisk Organ at Zion Mennonite Church. The aforementioned organists were attracted to the church because of this. I hope you will be able to experience the unique sounds of this organ which, in my opinion, is set in a sanctuary with acoustics that rival The Metropolitan Opera!



Philadelphia AGO Chapter Archives

A status report

he Chapter Archives Committee was established March 6, 2016 and has been up and running since then. There are currently four members who meet about once a month. They are Rae Ann Anderson, Dennis Elwell, Jeff Fowler, and Karen Whitney. The group has been methodically cataloging artifacts from the chapter's history. Each object is recorded in the database, then carefully placed in acid-free folders which are stored in archival banker's boxes

We are fortunate as a chapter to have the Organ Historical Society as a resident, this thanks to the vision and generosity of Fred Haas and his family. OHS has been very good to the chapter archives in that they have from the beginning of their time at Stoneleigh granted us space for our meetings and for storage of the archives. Over the chapter's 121 year history, there have been various attempts to establish an archive. Names associated with these attempts over the years include Ethel Reed, Nelson Buechner, Arthur Zbinden, Lois Ruth, and Fred Kent.

At this point, we have archived, scanned, and annotated the 797 Executive Committee meeting minutes in our possession. 707 issues of Crescendo, the entire 81 year run from 1942 to the present, have been scanned (3,164 manual scans of 6,262 physical pages from 1942 to 2004) or downloaded (2004 to 2023) and are in the process of being annotated. The minutes and Crescendo files are all searchable. The history of the chapter inhabits those pages.

The artifacts in our possession pertaining to Conventions and Workshops have been completely archived as have Chapter Directories. The Programs Archive is comprised of 297 chapter programs and Philadelphia organ concerts described and annotated. Ideally, the archived artifact is the original physical copy. When this is not possible, a photocopy, when available, stands in the stead of the event until the original artifact is found. There is more to do. Publicity and promotional materials, Pipe Organ Encounters, music composed by Philadelphia organists, and books germane to our research remain to be cataloged.



The scope of our work in point of fact goes beyond the chapter. The collection goes further by design to include records relative to the organ and organists that predate the existence of the chapter or those that relate to organizations with similar objectives. Examples of this include the National Association of Organists (1908-1935) and the American Organ Players Club (1890- 1980s). Ultimately, a finding aid will be created and posted online by the Organ Historical Society, the archive then available for research. Work on that is in process.

You can help the project by taking the time to look through your own collection of old programs, music, and materials and donate them to the archive. Check your attic, your basement, and your piano bench, especially if you are a saver. Please contact me if you have anything to contribute. As the donor, your name is noted in the database, preserved for posterity. Perhaps you know something and can provide clues to our search for the remains of past attempts by the chapter to create an archive. Regrettably, we can only guess what became of those treasures.


