

The Pasi Opus 17 Pipe Organ

of Trinity Episcopal Church, Solebury

This organ was designed and built by Martin Pasi of Pasi Organ Builders, located in Roy, Washington. It was created specifically to suit the Trinity Episcopal Church space.

The divisions include Great, Swell (with expression) and Pedal. The process from dream to reality took the parish from the 1990's to late winter, 2006. This beautiful instrument has been a welcome center to music within worship life at Trinity. Specifications are as follows:

Jonathan William Moyer is the David S. Boe chair and associate professor of organ at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. He is organist of the Church of the Covenant in Cleveland, OH, and has been a visiting-lecturer in organ at the Hochschule für Musik in Lübeck, Germany. He performs a vast repertoire spanning from the renaissance to the modern era, and has concertized throughout the United States, Europe and Japan. Clevelandclassical.com has said of Moyer's playing, "It's delightful to hear an organ recital where everything seems so right and the playing so much in the service of the instrument and the repertoire."

His recent concerts include St. Katharinen (Hamburg), St. Johannis (Lüneburg), Schwerin Cathedral. St. Jakobi (Lübeck), Marienkirche (Berlin), Ludgerikirche (Norden), Laurenskerk (Alkmaar), the Marktkirchethe (Hannover), Blois Cathedral (France), and J.S. Bach's complete Clavierübung III at the German Reformed Church in Budapest, Hungary. He has performed with numerous ensembles including the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Boston Pops, the Tanglewood Festival Orchestra, Blue Water Chamber Orchestra of Cleveland, Richmond Symphony Orchestra, the Oberlin Symphony Orchestra, Concert Artists of Baltimore, and the Handel Choir of Baltimore. His performances have been featured on NPR's nationally syndicated program Pipe Dreams, and he has performed at Conventions for the American Guild of Organists and the Organ Historical Society.

At the Church of the Covenant, Dr. Moyer oversees two remarkable pipe organs (Richards Fowkes, Op. 19 and E.M. Skinner/Aeolian Skinner/Holtkamp. His lauded CD "Voices of the Hanse," recorded on the 1637 Stellwagen organ in Lübeck, Germany was released on <u>Gothic Records</u> and features music from 17th-century North German sources. He recently recorded volume 2 on the organ by John Brombaugh at Central Lutheran Church, Eugene, Oregon.

Dr. Moyers holds degrees in organ and piano from Oberlin Conservatory of Music, the Peabody Institute of Music, and Bob Jones University. His teachers include Donald Sutherland, Gillian Weir, James David Christie, Olivier Latry, Ann Schein, and Webb Wiggins. In 2008, he received the second prize in the Sixth International Musashino Organ Competition in Tokyo, Japan, and in 2005 he was a finalist in the St. Albans International Organ Competition. He is represented by <u>WindWerk Artists</u>.

Dr. Moyer resides in Shaker Heights, Ohio, along with his wife, organist, Dr. Kaori Hongo, and sons, Christopher Sho and Samuel Kazu.





Held every December, the Lucia Fest is an annual festival of light which celebrates Gloria Dei' Swedish heritage. 2024 will be the 87th year of the festival, which features dozens of children – from preschool through high school – and is attended by hundreds of people every year. Working in collaboration with the Rector of Gloria Dei and the Lucia Fest Director, the Musical Director will oversee and support all aspects of the musical performances that are the heart of the festival.

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Positions Available

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It is essential that the Musical Director is comfortable working with children (and a few adults) of all ability levels; our highest priority moving forward is to ensure that participating in the festival is a joyful experience for everyone involved.

The Musical Director will:

1. In conversation with the Rector and Lucia Fest Director, plan a series of rehearsals to prepare all performers – especially the children – to sing and perform in the festival.

2. Oversee all musical and performance aspects of the rehearsals, to include coaching groups of children in singing traditional Swedish music.

3. Play the organ at Gloria Dei during each of the 6 performances that make up the festival.

4. Foster a safe, supportive, and joyful environment for everyone involved in the festival.

The Musical Director:

1. Must have experience of teaching / coaching children for musical performances.

2. Must be able to play Gloria Dei's 1903 Hook and Hastings organ.

3. Must understand and be supportive of the open, welcoming, and joyful environment that Gloria Dei is seeking to establish.

4. Must be a team player, able to collaborate with a wide array of volunteers, many of whom have been involved in the festival for decades and love it dearly.

The Musical Director will report to the Rector of Gloria Dei and will work closely with the Lucia Fest Director. Doylestown United Methodist Church, Doylestown, PA, an active and growing congregation of the United Methodist Church, seeks an organist / accompanist for liturgical worship services. The sanctuary organ was built in 1926 by the Midmer-Losh Company (known for their unique "lever-arm" chest actions and later as the famed firm that built the Atlantic City Convention Hall organ, which is the largest in the world). The instrument was moved to the current church building in 1967. Emery Brothers re-leathered the chests of the Swell and Great around 2010 and 2013, respectively. In 2019-20, a new console and chamber relay system was installed, three new ranks of pipes were added, the console was completely rebuilt with new keyboards and controls, and all reed pipes were restored.

Duties and Responsibilities:

• Provide organ and piano music for the liturgical/traditional services in coordination with the Director of Music Ministries. This will include hymns, prelude, postlude, an occasional offertory and accompanying soloists and ensembles, and extra services e.g., Ash Wednesday, Lent, Palm Sunday, Easter, and two services on Christmas Eve.

• Provide instrumental support for additional services at the church, e.g., weddings, funerals, prayer services. The church will arrange and request for those services. Additional compensation will be given. • Perform other duties as may become necessary in the team ministry of the Church and assigned by the Director of Music Ministries, Pastors, or Worship Committee.

Recent renovations of our 650-seat sanctuary significantly improved acoustics, provided a multi-tier choir pew under the organ chambers, expanded the chancel platform area, and added an upgraded audiovisual system and streaming capabilities.

The Director of Music Ministries will also serve as the focus for our interactions with community musical groups, including the adjacent University of Delaware with its renowned School of Music. The Sanctuary renovations, coupled with our location and expansive free parking, make the church an ideal venue for worship music and concerts. Our church is within
